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Introduction



The Assessment

Acumen is a critical reasoning test designed to measure a person's ability to conceptualise, analyse, question and evaluate ideas. Critical Reasoning is an important component of decision making as it influences how well somebody can understand and make use of complex information. The Critical Reasoning Test assesses aptitude in the following areas:

- Recognising assumptions
- Evaluating arguments
- Drawing conclusions
- Identifying trends
- Making effective decisions



The Report

Rating Scale

Charts in this report are described in terms of a standardised Sten score that is presented on a scale of 1 to 10 and which allows us to compare participant results. As a guide, scores of 1 to 3 are considered well below average, while scores of 5 to 6 are average, and scores of 8 to 10 are considered well above average.

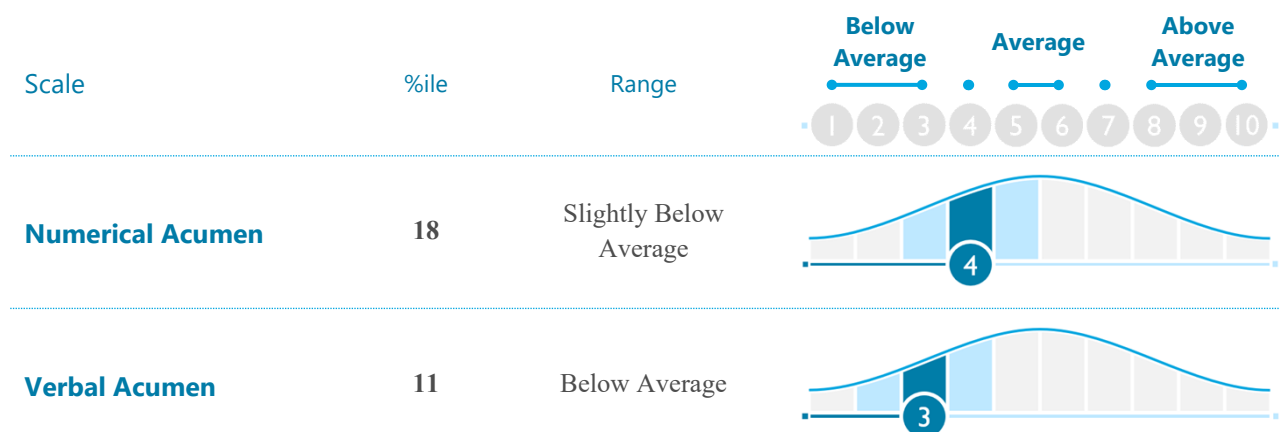


Profile Summary

The following elements are used to describe the results.

Percentile Score (%ile)	Is a value on a scale of 100 that reflects the percentage of people in a sample who score below the participant's score.
Range	This is a qualitative indicator that is based on the Sten score and indicates how well a participant has performed using a 5-point score band.
Sten Score (1-10)	A Sten score is a standardised measure used to compare participant results. Presented on a 10-point scale, a score of 1 indicates low performance and a score of 10 indicates high performance.

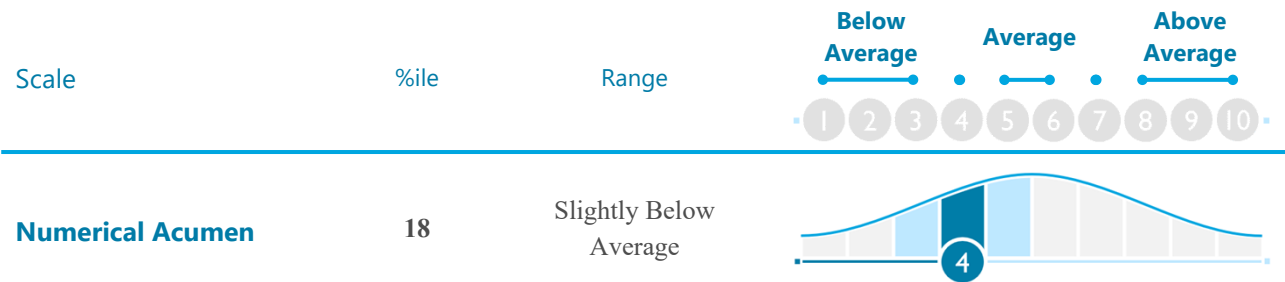
Profile Charts



Results in Detail

Numerical Acumen

Numerical Critical Reasoning assesses a person's ability to identify trends in complex data and use numbers in a rational and logical way.



Profile Description

- Compared to the reference group, Sam's score on the numerical acumen test places them in the slightly below average range.
- Scoring in this range suggests that their numerical critical reasoning ability may be slightly weaker than that of other employees.
- While they should have little difficulty evaluating everyday numerical and statistical information, it may take them some time to fully comprehend more complex sets of data and draw correct conclusions from them.

Development Recommendations

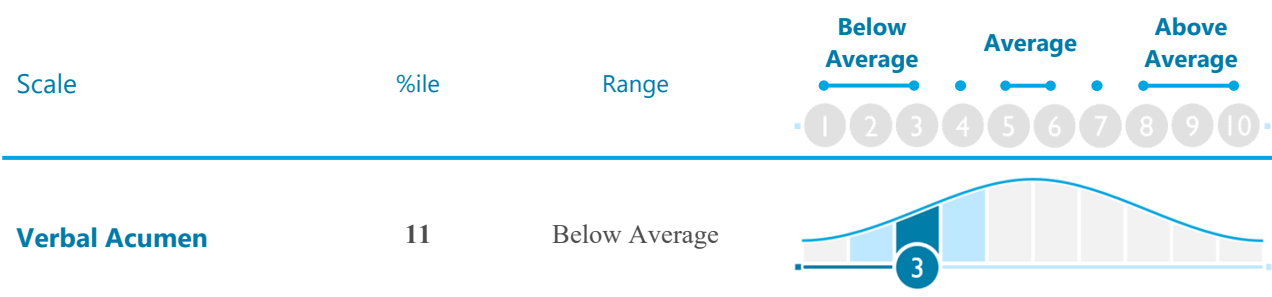
- Encourage Sam to practice numerical skills at work.
- If they prefer a structured approach to learning then have them consider signing up for courses in business statistics and numerical skills.
- Provide Sam with assignments that are technical in nature and require the use of numerical and problem-solving skills.

Verbal Acumen

- Scoring in this range suggests that they may have difficulty evaluating written arguments and drawing correct conclusions.
- While they should comprehend everyday written arguments, it may take them some time to fully appreciate the nuances of more complicated arguments.

Development Recommendations

- Invite Sam to use a self-questioning strategy when reading complex material which involves asking questions about the subject they are reading.
- Encourage them to practice writing for different audiences.
- Recommend that they subscribe to journals on topics of interest.
- Encourage them to verbalise what they want to write, and then work with them to structure arguments in a logical way.
- Encourage Sam to build their social connections, so as to be exposed to different conversations.
