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
Introduction

Horizons is based on one of the most widely accepted models of career themes today; namely, the 'Holland' model of general career themes. Summarised by the mnemonic RIASEC, Horizons measures Realistic, Investigative, Artistic, Social, Enterprising and Conventional career themes. It does so by comparing an individual's preferences relative to each other to determine their top interests. Horizons supports development and career guidance for young people, school leavers, recent graduates or general level staff.

The contents of this report can be used to support your career decisions.



Rating Scale
